# Saturday Summer Pennant 2004/2005

## PLAYING RULES & CONDITIONS

- Teams:** Shall comprise three unisex players. An emergency may play for more than one club subject to clause 10 and 11. Each must be a current financial member of a participating club.
- Format of Play:**  

<b>Home &amp; Away Matches - each player</b>		
Singles Rubber	(1)	Best of 3 sets, third set super 10 point tie breaker
Doubles Sets	(2)	1 x 8 game sets (t/b at 7-all)

**All Finals Matches** (to qualify players must have played 3 home and away matches)

As above
- Order of Play:** **Home and away, and finals matches:** Two courts are to be occupied with a singles and a doubles match. The visiting team captain shall have the choice of the first rubbers, followed by the home team captain with the second choice, and alternating through the day, unless the captains agree otherwise. A player is entitled to a 20 minute rest between a singles and doubles rubber.
- Start & End of Play:** All players are expected to be present for the start at 1.00 pm sharp unless approval has been mutually agreed by captains prior to commencement of play. Where court lights are available and there has been no hold up because of bad weather (including a heatout), play must be finished under lights. Where play has been lost due to bad weather, lights can only be used if captains mutually agree. Court lights should be turned on when streetlights have been turned on.
- Penalties: Non-arrival:** Unless previously agreed by both captains, where a player is drawn to play, but is not present, that player shall forfeit six games after ten minutes, and if not present after another ten minutes, the rubber shall be forfeited.
- Number and Quality of Balls:** The home team shall supply at least four new Tennis Victoria approved balls for each home and away match, and players can expect a suitable standard of used balls for their rubber where new balls are not allocated. If not satisfied, a player shall approach their captain to arrange a replacement pair.
- Washouts:** In the event of two consecutive hours being lost, either including commencement of play, or during play, play will be abandoned unless both captains mutually agree to continue. If captains cannot agree on the use of rain effected courts then a non-playing executive of the home club shall make the final decision as to playability.
- Heatouts:** Where the outside temperature in the shade is more than 35°C play shall be suspended. In the event of two consecutive hours being lost, either including commencement of play, or during play, play will be abandoned unless both captains mutually agree to continue after the temperature falls below 35°C (subject to rule 4). If captains cannot agree on the return of play then a non-playing executive of the home club shall make the final decision as to playability.
- Ladder Positions:** A match result will be determined by a team winning the most rubbers. Two premiership points will be awarded for a match win. One premiership point will be awarded for each set won. Ladder positions will be determined by premiership points first, followed by percentage of games won vs. games lost. In washout and heatout matches, where a team reaches an unbeatable position, that team will be awarded two premiership points and both teams will be awarded the sets and games they have won, and unplayed sets will be divided equally. If the match is undecided and either team could win, then each will be awarded any sets and games they have won, and unplayed sets will be divided equally. If a match is washed out or heated out, each team receives 3 points. A team given a forfeit will receive 6 premiership points. In the case of a tie, premiership points will be split 1 each.
- Order of Merit:** The final order of merit must be nominated after round 3 and approved by the match committee. A nominated player cannot play below the nominated position and cannot fill in for another team unless there is a bye. Offending teams risk loss of premiership points, sets and games for any contravention.
- Emergencies:** An emergency cannot be of a better standard than the replaced player and shall be played in order of merit or risk loss of premiership points, sets and games for that emergency's matches. Where there is a bye in the competition, the bye team members can be used as emergencies. If a captain is in doubt as to the position of play of an emergency, approval shall be sought from the match committee whose decision shall be final. Teams are encouraged to lodge a protest against any possible offending team not obtaining approval. Emergencies may fill in for more than one team, subject to clause 1, but after playing 5 matches with a team they cannot thereafter fill in for another team.
- Afternoon Tea:** The home team shall supply afternoon tea which is encouraged to take place around the end of the doubles rubbers.
- Finals:**  

<b>Semi-finals:</b>	Shall be 1 <sup>st</sup> vs 2 <sup>nd</sup> and 3 <sup>rd</sup> vs 4 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Preliminary Finals:</b>	Shall be loser of 1 <sup>st</sup> v 2 <sup>nd</sup> vs winner 3 <sup>rd</sup> v 4 <sup>th</sup>
<b>Grand-final:</b>	Shall be winner of 1 <sup>st</sup> vs 2 <sup>nd</sup> vs Preliminary Final winner		
<b>Venues:</b>	Teams finishing in a higher ladder position shall have choice of venue for play.		
<b>Balls:</b>	Each team shall supply four new balls each.		
- Protests:** **Start of play and/or order of merit:** A protest must be declared by a captain before the offending situation is completed, and written on the scoresheet, and should be acknowledged with the initials of the opposing captain.
- Player conduct:** If, after a player receives one warning from either captain, the offending situation continues, a protest must be declared, written on the scoresheet, and should be acknowledged with the initials of the opposing captain before completion of the offending rubber. For failure by an opposing captain to initial the protest **PENALTY TWO PREMIERSHIP POINTS** for each protest not so acknowledged.

- Dispute Committee:** Each team entered in the pennant shall provide one person for the determination of a dispute.
